WoVOCon UnConference DO's & DON'Ts

<u>DON'T</u>

- **Don't** assume anyone else knows more (or less) than you do. You never know who is going to be interested in what you think or are concerned about ... or even your success.
- **Don't** be upset if only two people show up to a breakout session you suggested. Those two people are the ones who share your interests, and they really want to know what you have to offer.
- **Don't** feel that you have to "fill" up a specific amount of time. If what you have to say only takes 15 minutes and the group has finished interacting then the session can end. At the start of WoVOCon UnConference, we will discuss guidelines for how this can happen.
- **Don't** feel pressure to have everything take "only" an hour. If you start with a short presentation, then a group conversation gets going, and your discussion needs to continue beyond an hour find a way to make this happen.

<u>DO</u>


- **Do** develop some ideas about what motivates you, what is bothering you (and a possible solution), and prepare to have fun!

- Do remember: there is no such thing as "failure" at WoVOCon UnConference!


'Pat on the Back' Stickers

Hotel and Transportation Information

Hotel name/address:

Transportation:

1. <u>Taxi or Rideshare (Uber/Lyft)</u> Time: Approximately 30-50 minutes, depending on traffic. Cost: Around \$40-\$60.

Other transportation companies: <u>https://sit.ghe.mybluehost.me/</u> Chicago Transportation Services | Midway Airport Car Service <u>https://www.ametransportation.com/</u> Windy City Limousine & Bus <u>https://windycitylimos.com/</u> Details: Follow signs for taxis or rideshares outside the terminal.

- <u>Airport Shuttle</u> check <u>https://www.flychicago.com</u> for your airport Check for shuttle services like GO Airport Express <u>https://www.airportexpress.com/</u> Cost: up to 3 passengers/3 bags \$78 Book in advance if possible.
- 3. Public Transit

<u>O'Hare</u> (CTA Blue Line + Bus/Walk)

Time: Approximately 1 hour 15 minutes.

Cost: \$5 (train fare).

Details: Take the Blue Line train from O'Hare to Washington Station.

Transfer to the 156 or 151 bus, or walk (about 15-20 minutes) to the hotel.

Midway (CTA Orange Line + Red Line/Walk)

Time: Approximately 45 minutes.

Cost: \$5 (train fare).

Details: Take the CTA Orange Line train from Midway to the "State & Harold Washington" stop. Transfer to the Red Line at "State & 35th" and head north. Get off at "Chicago" station and walk a few blocks to the hotel. This option is more economical but may take longer.

4. Rental Car

Time: Similar to taxi/rideshare.

Details: Follow signs to the rental car center at the airport, then drive to the hotel. Hotel Parking info: If you're driving in, The Royal Sonesta Chicago River North offers valet parking for an overnight fee of \$75 per night with three in-and-out privileges.

Restaurants (mostly within walking distance)

- <u>Asian</u>: unless you Uber to Chinatown, frankly Chicago's Chinese restaurants are mediocre. But for some reason, we have a ton of great Thai places – but none within walking distance.
- <u>Breakfast</u>: There's a great breakfast place in Marina City <u>Yolk</u> at 340 N. State www.eatyolk.com It opens at 7am for the early risers.
- <u>Cafe</u>: For more price-conscious people the <u>food court</u> at the Nordstrom mall is delish as is <u>Cafe Nordstrom</u> in the store itself.
- <u>Cheezburger</u>: The famous <u>Billy Goat Tavern</u> is just below Michigan Ave (Lower Michigan) at Hubbard. Home to the Cheezburger, Cheezburger of SNL fame, the burgers are actually not bad and the buns are yummy. Can get overrun with tourists but definitely worth a stop.
- **Chicago Dog** with all the fixins? Get one at any of the Italian Beef places, or **Portillo's**.
- Pizza: If you must try Chicago deep-dish, I only recommend two places: There is a Lou Malnati's within walking distance. Pizza Uno and Due are close-by Chicago-style joints, but avoid Gino's East. But the BEST choice is Pequod's, which has a national rep; grab an Uber (it's not walkable), and prepare to wait in line. Another Italian/pizza place is Pizzeria Portofino's. They are a bit more upscale than a Chicago-style place but have craft pizzas, pasta, and seafood; and it's right on the river, so the view can't be beat.
- <u>Italian Beef</u>: If you've watched The Bear and want to try an Italian Beef, the absolute best is the <u>Al's Italian Beef</u> (that's an Uber ride). Within walking distance are another Al's store (not as good as the original on Taylor but still good), or <u>Mr. Beef</u> (which I do believe is THE store you see on The Bear!). Lines might be shorter at Al's.
- <u>Italian</u>: <u>Eataly's</u> is a tourist trap, but I think the food there is pretty darn good. It features many options on several floors along with shopping, mostly cafeteria-style. If you want a sit down experience, <u>Quartino's</u> is a lot of fun for groups it's small, shareable plates. <u>Osetario via Stato</u> is very good. In the mid range (\$30-50) is <u>Volare</u> it's homestyle Italian with transformational tiramisu. They can handle large crowds with ease. An Uber ride away: <u>Anteprima</u> in Andersonville is a personal favorite.
- <u>Mexican</u>: Rick Bayless has several restaurants in Chicago, the first I'll suggest is <u>Xoco</u>, which is very casual Mexican "street food." It's cafeteria style and pretty reasonable, and the food knocks my socks off. <u>Su Casa Mexican</u> is pretty good in the \$20-\$40 range. \$\$\$ and up Mexican options: <u>Indienne</u> very pricey but the memories will last a lifetime, if you want to splurge and enjoy one of the best meals of your life. Upscale, innovative, Indian-inspired cuisine, gorgeously presented. Some say the vegan menu is the best. <u>Carnivale</u> a very fun and colorful place in the Fulton Market neighborhood.
- <u>Seafood</u>: <u>Shaw's Crab House</u> is an amazing seafood place. They have a very nice dining room with white tablecloths and professional waiters, and a more intimate casual Oyster Bar. You can get the full menu in the bar. A little expensive but never disappoints.
- <u>Steak and Basic Italian</u>: <u>Harry Caray's</u> somewhat pricey and gets a fair amount of tourists but it never disappoints.
- <u>Steak and Seafood</u>: <u>Wollensky's</u> has a great atmosphere. Also on the river Wollensky Grill is in the \$25-50 entree range, but is yummy and the pretzel rolls are divine.

- <u>Jazz</u>: <u>Andy's Jazz Club</u> is a fantastic place to grab a bite and hear live Jazz music. It's a quiet room, so no talking during the performance. There is a \$20 cover charge, but a really good evening to be had. They usually have 3 shows a night.
- Live Music: How At the Moon is fun. They have mostly bar appetizers, but the atmosphere is infectious. It is noisy, but might be a good option for people.

Fun Things to DO or SEE:

- River Walk. It goes from the lake all the way over to where the river splits north and south. You can access it from the south side of the river at most intersections from staircases that go down to river level. There are lots of tourists on the walk but it's well lit, has some overpriced restaurants, and loads of police presence (so safety shouldn't be an issue). It's a great free way to see the city from the river viewpoint. And we are very proud of our river. There still should be fairly decent boat traffic that time of year, weather dependent.
- <u>The Apple Store</u> is right on the river at Michigan Ave, and is worth a stop. It's a beautiful store with a fantastic view. The Windows people won't be interested, but the Maccies will.
- Chicago is world HQ for <u>McDonalds</u>, and we have an international MickeyD's at 1035 W. Randolph Street. This is the home of <u>Hamburger University</u> and they test out a lot of different food recipes there. They have the expected, but they also rotate global offerings throughout the year. It's pretty cool to see what other nations eat (like Aloo Tikki Indian, McCafe apple fritter, Canada's ghost pepper McChicken, China's Cheese and BBQ fries). It's a cab ride or Uber away.
- <u>Magic</u>: Chicago is becoming more renowned for its magic! There are several extraordinarily entertaining options, and they aren't overly expensive.
- <u>Untouchable Gangster Tours</u> is the oldest gangster tour in Chicago and a grand old time to see a lot of the city. The guides are all actors and love to share fun stories about the city's criminal past. Tell them (Hanna Vergara) sent you, and the boss can help you figure out a private tour or offer a group rate on one of the regular tours.
- The <u>Architecture Cruise</u> is probably my favorite touristy thing to do. Offered through the architecture foundation.
- Go to the <u>Tribune Tower</u> and look at the <u>stones on the walls</u> from 3000 years of world history.
- <u>Ghirardelli Chocolate</u> is right on the river, and it's fun to get cocoa or a sundae and watch the boats.


A word about Yelp reviews. Yelp is a super helpful app, but it is not gospel. Some reviewers' favorite places in town are only rated 3.5 – 4.0 stars. On the other hand, some highly-rated places can disappoint. It depends on your expectations and experience with food. A super-authentic ethnic restaurant may not please all palates, but for those who know the cuisine they are the best choices – and many are not above 4 stars!
